

**COMMUNITY BASICS** - helping meet basic needs of people. Stabilizing lives with a safety net - people's basic need of food, shelter, safety and inclusivity are addressed

Vulnerable residents have access to 172,500 nutritious meals

1,260 children and youth experience safe interactions with caregivers and peers

890 low-income residents have access to basic legal representation and education

1,715 vulnerable seniors and those with limited resources remain in their homes longer through case management and services provided by volunteer networks

**HEALTH** - people achieve optimal health through promoting wellness and health care access - people's health improves

3,520 under/uninsured 3-14 year-olds receive preventive dental care and education

- Children's Dental Health Services - Olmsted Happy Teeth - \$ 29,592

3,700 uninsured Olmsted County residents receive basic health care to stabilize and improve their health

Uninsured people receive early interventions for mental illness in community settings

**EDUCATION** - supporting learning and development of children and youth so they become responsible, contributing citizens - children are prepared to succeed in school, youth are prepared to succeed in the community

75% (or 10%> Olmsted County findings) of children are rated proficient in Kindergarten preparedness assessments

90% of registered low-income K-12 youth start school each year with appropriate school supplies

**FINANCIAL STABILITY** - increasing income, assets, and job training for improved employability - people move toward financial independence

400 people at or below 280% poverty complete job skills training and gain employment working 30+ hrs/wk, 45 wks/yr, w/health benefits, earning > \$10/hr

- Catholic Charities, IMAA, ISD 535, RCTC, Workforce Development Inc, Workforce Center – Job Training Partnership - \$127,703

65 families achieve stabilization with housing, employment or education and build assets

- Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Winona - Refugee Resettlement - \$ 15,000
- Interfaith Hospitality Network of Greater Rochester - Family Stabilizer - \$ 25,000
- Rochester Area Family Y - LINK - \$ 7,000

10,650 tax returns are filed returning \$10.2 million in Earned Income Tax Credit and Working Family Credit to hard-working individuals and families
