## A Day in the Life of Your United Way Investment

6 am	Early drop off for childcare begins as working families start their day.	2 pm	A low-income tenant gains access to and representation in the legal system, preserving her rights.	10 pm	High school youth are wrapping up an evening of fitness for life and leadership activities.
7 am	Camp counselors are preparing for the day's activities before the summer day campers arrive.	3 pm	Youth eat a nutritious snack, play dodge ball and get home work help in an after-school setting rather than go to an empty home.	11 pm	A laid off worker is talking to a warm line volunteer for support and coping skills.
8 am	A classroom of 4 year olds practices phonetic sounds and engages in group play.	4 pm	A mentor meets with her assigned child to bake cookies and cycle the bike paths together.	Midnight	A senior searches the electronic data base for volunteer opportunities which utilizes their skills and knowledge.
9 am	The mobile dental clinic is set up at an elementary school and begins seeing uninsured students.	5 pm	Volunteer medical staff begin seeing low-income patients, diverting emergency room visits.	1 am	A postal delivery truck loads books from Imagination Library ready for delivery in the mail for a child.
10 am	A peer counselor arrives to help a lonely senior cope with grief and loss.	6 pm	An educational session is starting for grandparents who are raising their grandchildren.	2 am	Parents are better able to cope with their situation knowing their infant sleeps safely and soundly in crisis care.
11 am	Meals are delivered to seniors in Olmsted County, allowing them to live more independently.	7 pm	A child is playing dominoes with dad in a safe and supervised environment.	3 am	The 2-1-1 line is taking calls from area residents needing information and referrals on disaster recovery.
Noon	Youth canoe the lake, collect water samples, conduct science experiments in an outdoor setting.	8 pm	A new family in the community meets with an Hispanic community health outreach worker for help in completing medical forms for an upcoming appointment.	4 am	A delivery truck is being loaded with fresh, locally grown, donated vegetables for area food pantries helping people access nutritious food.
1 pm	Elementary teachers complete summer training to improve reading performance for all students.	9 pm	Homeless families are completing a life skills and financial literacy class at the shelter.	5 am	A young man with a developmental disability is rising to prepare for his job at the warehouse with his job coach.
